



The flagships of our catalogue are *The Noble Qur'an* – *a new rendering of its meanings in English* (published by Ta-Ha Publishing of London). Then there are the *Muwatta* of Imam Malik and *Muhammad Messenger of Allah* (*ash-Shifa*) by Qadi 'Iyad all translated by by Aisha Bewley and edited by Abdalhaqq Bewley.

Diwan Press specialise in works on the figh of the School of Madina as transmitted by Imam Malik such as The Risalah of Ibn Abi Zayd al-Qayrawani of which we have also published a bi-lingual edition, and on the Tasawwuf of the Sunna such as the Diwan of Shaykh Muhammad ibn al-Habib, and the famed Dargawi Way, which contains the letter of Shaykh Moulay al-'Arabi ad-Dargawi to his murids, of which a second edition is under preparation. Diwan Press also publish works dealing with the world situation today and its history and economics, both in the lands of the Muslims and the West, for example Democratic *Tyranny and the Islamic Paradigm* by Aisha Bewley, now with a serious update in 2025. Among the latter are some key works of Shaykh Dr. Abdalqadir as-Sufi such as Sultaniyya on the nature of political authority in Islam, and his *Technique of the Coup de* Banque on the foundation of the modern state in the French Revolution and the hand that finance plays in that today.



Abū 'Abdullāh Muḥammad ibn Aḥmad ibn Abī Bakr ibn Farḥ al-Anṣārī al-Khazrajī al-Andalusī Al-Qurṭubī (610-11 AH/1214 CE – 671 AH/1273 CE) was born in Cordoba in Spain, but moved in 1236 to Cairo in Egypt, where he lived until his death. He was Mālikī in fiqh, and although he composed other works he is most famous for this $tafs\bar{t}r$.

The $s\bar{u}rah$ concludes with the account of the Prophet 'Īsā, peace be upon him, and his disciples and of the Table sent down from Heaven.

Sūrat al-An'ām was revealed all at once except for six $\bar{a}yats$ – because it constitutes a single argument – and it was accompanied by seventy thousand angels. It provides the basic premises for arguing against many false positions. *Uşūl ad-dīn* is founded on it because it contains clear $\bar{a}yats$ that refute the Qadariyyah proponents of free will who deny the Decree.
